Elusive in Kent!



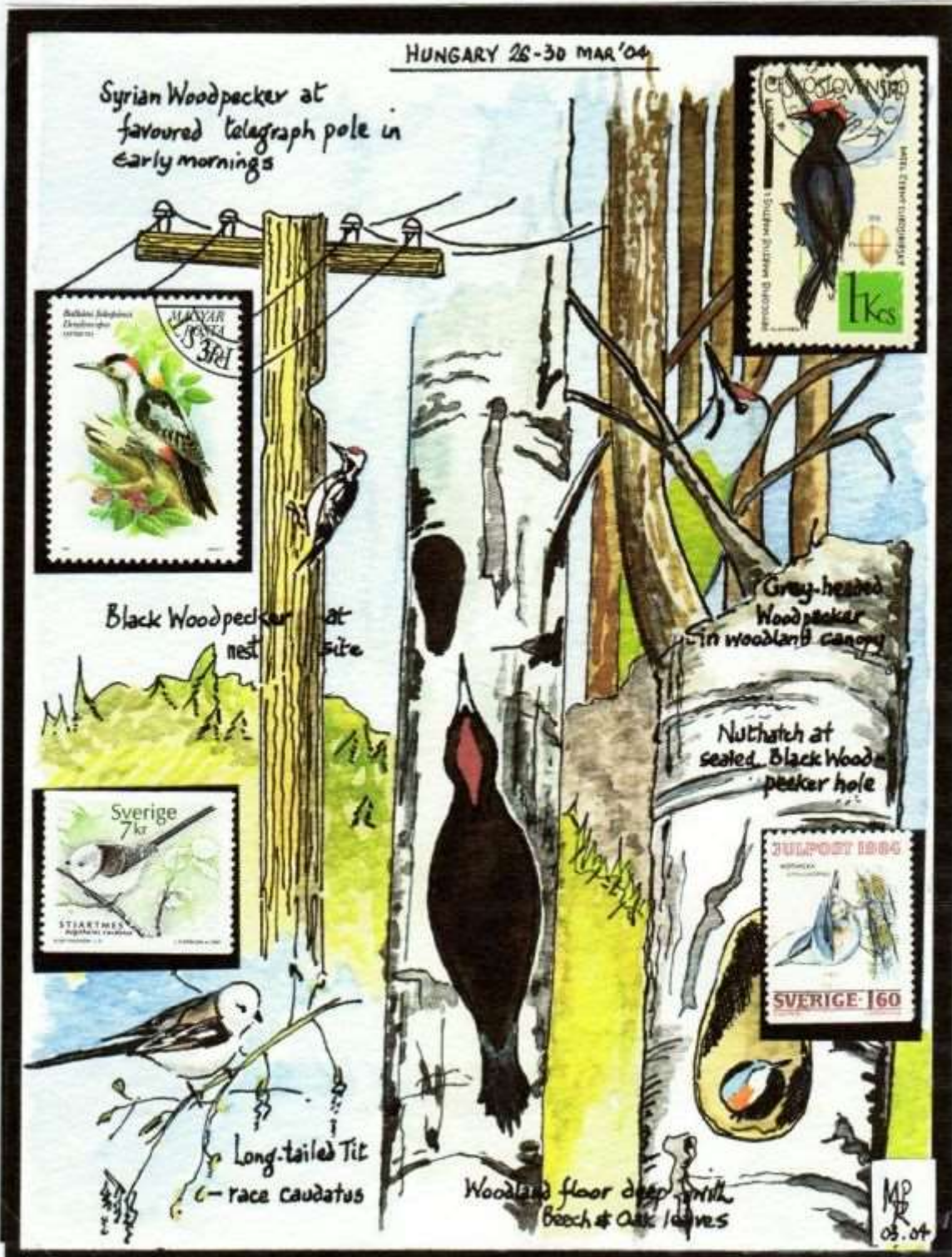
